

Guidelines for Conducting Skill-Based Certificate Course by the PG Departments

1.0 GENERAL GUIDELINES

- a) Skill-Based Certificate Courses (SBCCs) will be offered by P.G. Departments.
- b) One PG Department can offer more than one course, if interested.
- c) Any PG student can opt any SBCC available in the University irrespective of discipline of study, subject to 60% students from own Department and 40% students from other PG Departments.
- d) SBCC is not mandatory to qualify for any program and the credits earned through the Value-Added Courses shall not be accumulated for semester examination.
- e) The credits earned through SBCC shall not be considered for calculating GPA and CGPA for the parent program.
- f) It is a teacher assisted learning course open to all students without any additional fee.
- g) Each student has to submit her name, opting any SBCC to the HOD of her Department.
- h) The concerned HOD will compile the names for the SBCC and submit the list of students course-wise.
- i) A student will be permitted to register only one SBCC in a Semester.
- j) Classes for a SBCC will be taken during the reserved Time Slot in a week or beyond the regular class hours.
- k) The SBCCs may be also conducted during weekends.
- 1) The SBCC will be conducted only if there are at least 5 students opting for it.

2.0 DURATION

The duration of this course is **36** hours with a combination 20 hours of theory and 16 hours of practical.

3.0 REGISTRATION

The list of Department-wise SBCCs shall be displayed in the University Website along with the syllabus by the CPGC office. Each student has to submit her name opting any SBCC to the HOD of her Department. The Heads of respective Departments shall submit the list of students interested for the particular course, to the CPGC.

4.0 VENUE

The venue for the SBCCs shall be the Department Classrooms.

5.0 TIME SLOT

A fixed slot of two hours may be reserved for SBCCs during 2nd and/or 3rd Semesters. The time slot may be designed preferably in morning hours or afternoon beyond regular class hours. The HOD will prepare a timetable for the same. The course teacher/ HoD will communicate to other Departments before the start of the course.

6.0 ATTENDANCE

- Attendance and Examination Record of students will be maintained by the course teacher. A register will be maintained on students' attendance, marks obtained in the examination.
- The records shall be signed by both course teacher and the HoD and will be kept for documentation. Each student must have a minimum of 75% attendance in all the courses of the particular semester failing which she will not be permitted to appear the examination.

7.0 EXAMINATION

- i. The SBCC will carry full marks 50 (3 credits).
- ii. There shall be theory and practical examination carrying 25 marks each.
- iii. Practical examination will carry Lab Works/ Term Papers/ Project Reports/ Seminar Presentations/ Review of Journal Articles, Films etc. as applicable for the course; and reporting.
- iv. Theory examination will be of one hour duration and it will cover entire modules of the course.
- v. The Question Papers will be framed to test different levels of learning based on Revised Bloom's taxonomy viz. Remembering, Understanding, Applying, Analyzing, Evaluating and Creating (Anderson & Krathwohl, 2001).
- vi. The theory answer scripts shall be valued by the internal examiner of the Department appointed by the HoD.

8.0 AWARDING GRADES AND CERTIFICATES

- i. The pass mark for SBCC shall be 50% of the marks prescribed for the course.
- ii. Letter grades will be awarded based on the percentage of marks obtained by a candidate in a course as per the table.




