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

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Shailabala Women's Autonomous College (Accredited 'A' Grade twice by NAAC in 2006 and 2017), an epitome of academic excellence is a centenarian institution of higher education which has established itself as a citadel of women's education and empowerment for the state of Odisha. Situated near the holy shrine of Goddess Cuttack Chandi, the College building stands on the Madhusudhan Road/Mission Road in the silver city of Odisha, Cuttack. Ms Shailabala Das, the daughter of Utkal Gauraba Madhusudan Das, was a pioneer of women's education in Orissa (now Odisha). The joint efforts of Ms Shailabala Das and Mrs Banks (the first principal) succeeded in persuading the authorities in the Education Board meeting held at Ranchi in the opening up of an intermediate college for women in Orissa and it was opened in the erstwhile Ravenshaw Girls High School in 1913. The intermediate women's college was raised to the status of a first grade degree college in 1946. Pre-university Science and Pre-Professional Science classes were started in 1962 and 1963 respectively. Pass classes in Bachelor of Science and Honours classes in Science were started in 1966 and 1973 respectively. The college achieved another landmark in its academic progress when Post-Graduate course in Home Science was introduced in 1982-83. Post-Graduate classes in History and Sanskrit which began in 1993-94

were certainly another landmark in its academic journey. The college boasts the visit of Mahatma Gandhi, father of the Nation, twice during his Swaraj journey and the visit of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India to unveil the statue of Shri Madhusudan Das in the campus. At present, the College runs 24 UG, 22 PG and B.Ed programmes with near about 3000 students from all parts of the state and other neighbouring states on its rolls.

Abstract can only be considered for presentation after payment of registration fees.

ABOUT CUTTACK CITY

Cuttack is the former capital and the largest city in the Indian state of Odisha. It is the headquarters of the Cuttack district. The name of the city is an anglicised form of the Odia and Sanskrit name Kataka which literally means The Fort, a reference to the ancient Barabati Fort around which the city initially developed. Cuttack is known as the Millennium City as well as the Silver City due to its history of 1000 years and famous silver filigree works. The Orissa High Court is located there and the city is judiciary capital of Odisha. It is the commercial capital of Odisha which hosts many trading and business houses in and around the city. Cuttack is famous for its Durga Puja which is one of the most important festivals of Odisha. Being the favourite destination of poets and artists, it is also the cultural capital of Odisha. Due to its beauty, the term Kataka Nagara Dhabala Tagara is coined for it. The city is categorised as a Tier-II city as per the ranking system used by Government of India.
